

Part VI: Summary of the risk management plan

Summary of risk management plan for Sitagliptin Orion (sitagliptin)

This is a summary of the risk management plan (RMP) for Sitagliptin Orion. The RMP details important risks of Sitagliptin Orion, how these risks can be minimized, and how more information will be obtained about Sitagliptin Orion's risks and uncertainties (missing information).

Sitagliptin Orion's summary of product characteristics (SmPC) and its package leaflet give essential information to healthcare professionals and patients on how Sitagliptin Orion should be used.

Important new concerns or changes to the current ones will be included in updates of Sitagliptin Orion's RMP.

I. The medicine and what it is used for

Sitagliptin Orion is used in patients with type-2 diabetes to improve the control of blood glucose levels. It is used in addition to diet and exercise in the following ways:

- on its own, in patients who are not satisfactorily controlled on diet and exercise and in whom metformin is not suitable;
- in combination with metformin or a PPAR-gamma agonist such as a thiazolidinedione, in patients who are not satisfactorily controlled on metformin or the PPAR-gamma agonist used on its own;
- in combination with a sulphonylurea in patients who are not satisfactorily controlled with a sulphonylurea used on its own and in whom metformin is not suitable;
- in combination with both metformin, and a sulphonylurea or a PPAR-gamma agonist, in patients who are not satisfactorily controlled on the two medicines;
- in combination with insulin, with or without metformin, in patients who are not satisfactorily controlled on a stable dose of insulin (see SmPC for the full indication).

It contains sitagliptin as the active substance and it is given by mouth.

II. Risks associated with the medicine and activities to minimise or further characterise the risks

Important risks of Sitagliptin Orion, together with measures to minimise such risks and the proposed studies for learning more about Sitagliptin Orion's risks, are outlined below.

Measures to minimise the risks identified for medicinal products can be:

- Specific information, such as warnings, precautions, and advice on correct use, in the package leaflet and SmPC addressed to patients and healthcare professionals;
- Important advice on the medicine's packaging;
- The authorised pack size — the amount of medicine in a pack is chosen so to ensure that the medicine is used correctly;
- The medicine's legal status — the way a medicine is supplied to the patient (e.g. with or without prescription) can help to minimise its risks.

Together, these measures constitute routine risk minimisation measures.

In addition to these measures, information about adverse reactions is collected continuously and regularly analysed so that immediate action can be taken as necessary. These measures constitute *routine pharmacovigilance activities*.

II.A List of important risks and missing information

This product has no safety concerns requiring additional pharmacovigilance actions or additional risk minimisation activities.

Safety concerns are adequately addressed in the product information.

The safety information in the product information is aligned to the reference medicinal product.
