

Part VI: Summary of the risk management plan

Summary of risk management plan for Rivaroxaban Cipla 2.5, 10, 15 and 20 mg film-coated tablets

This is a summary of the risk management plan (RMP) for Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets. The RMP details important risks of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets, how these risks can be minimised, and how more information will be obtained about Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablet's risks and uncertainties (missing information).

Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablet's summary of product characteristics (SmPC) and its package leaflet give essential information to healthcare professionals and patients on how Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets should be used.

Important new concerns or changes to the current ones will be included in updates of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablet's RMP.

I. The medicine and what it is used for

Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablet is authorised for

- Prevention of atherothrombotic events in adult patients after an acute coronary syndrome (ACS) with elevated cardiac biomarkers
- Prevention of atherothrombotic events in adult patients with coronary artery disease (CAD) or symptomatic peripheral artery disease (PAD) at high risk of ischaemic events
- Prevention of venous thromboembolism (VTE) in adult patients undergoing elective hip or knee replacement surgery
- Treatment of deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and pulmonary embolism (PE), and prevention of recurrent DVT and PE in adults
- Prevention of stroke and systemic embolism in adult patients with non-valvular atrial fibrillation with one or more risk factors, such as congestive heart failure, hypertension, age \geq 75 years, diabetes mellitus, prior stroke or transient ischaemic attack

(see SmPC for the full indication). It contains rivaroxaban as the active substance and it is given by oral route.

II. Risks associated with the medicine and activities to minimise or further characterise the risks

Important risks of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets, together with measures to minimise such risks are outlined below.

Measures to minimise the risks identified for medicinal products can be:

- Specific information, such as warnings, precautions, and advice on correct use, in the package leaflet and SmPC addressed to patients and healthcare professionals;
- Important advice on the medicine's packaging;
- The authorised pack size — the amount of medicine in a pack is chosen to ensure that the medicine is used correctly;
- The medicine's legal status — the way a medicine is supplied to the patient (e.g. with or without prescription) can help to minimise its risks.

Together, these measures constitute *routine risk minimisation* measures.

In the case of rivaroxaban film-coated tablets, these measures are supplemented with additional risk minimisation measures mentioned under relevant important risks, below.

In addition to these measures, information about adverse reactions is collected continuously and regularly analysed so that immediate action can be taken as necessary. These measures constitute *routine pharmacovigilance activities*.

If important information that may affect the safe use of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets is not yet available, it is listed under 'missing information' below.

II.A List of important risks and missing information

Important risks of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets are risks that need special risk management activities to further investigate or minimise the risk, so that the medicinal product can be safely taken. Important risks can be regarded as identified or potential. Identified risks are concerns for which there is sufficient proof of a link with the use of Rivaroxaban Cipla film-coated tablets. Potential risks are concerns for which an association with the use of this medicine is possible based on available data, but this association has not been established yet and needs further evaluation. Missing information refers to information on the safety of the medicinal product that is currently missing and needs to be collected (e.g. on the long-term use of the medicine);
