

Part VI: Summary of the risk management plan

Summary of risk management plan for Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets (apixaban)

This is a summary of the risk management plan (RMP) for Apinovia 2.5 and 5 mg film-coated tablets. The RMP details important risks of Apinovia 2.5 and 5 mg film-coated tablets, how these risks can be minimised and how more information will be obtained about Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets risks and uncertainties (missing information).

Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets summary of product characteristics (SmPC) and its package leaflet give essential information to healthcare professionals and patients on how Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets should be used.

Important new concerns or changes to the current ones will be included in updates of Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets' RMP.

I. The medicine and what it is used for

Apinovia 2.5 mg film-coated tablets is authorized for the prevention of venous thromboembolic events (VTE) in adult patients who have undergone elective hip or knee replacement surgery; for the prevention of stroke and systemic embolism in adult patients with non-valvular atrial fibrillation (NVAf), with one or more risk factors, such as prior stroke or transient ischaemic attack (TIA); age $\geq$ 75 years; hypertension; diabetes mellitus; symptomatic heart failure (NYHA Class $\geq$ II), for the treatment of deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and pulmonary embolism (PE), and prevention of recurrent DVT and PE in adults, and for the treatment of VTE and prevention of VTE in paediatric patients from 28 days to less than 18 years of age.

Apinovia 5 mg film-coated tablets is authorized for the prevention of stroke and systemic embolism in adult patients with non-valvular atrial fibrillation (NVAf), with one or more risk factors, such as prior stroke or transient ischaemic attack (TIA); age $\geq$ 75 years; hypertension; diabetes mellitus; symptomatic heart failure (NYHA Class $\geq$ II), as well as for treatment of deep vein thrombosis (DVT) and pulmonary embolism (PE), and prevention of recurrent DVT and PE in adults, and prevention of recurrent DVT and PE in adults, and for the treatment of VTE and prevention of VTE in paediatric patients from 28 days to less than 18 years of age.

It contains apixaban as the active substance and it is given by oral route.

II. Risks associated with the medicine and activities to minimise or further characterise the risks

Important risks of Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets, together with measures to minimise such risks and the proposed studies for learning more about Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets's risks, are outlined below.

Measures to minimise the risks identified for medicinal products can be:

- Specific information, such as warnings, precautions, and advice on correct use, in the package leaflet and SmPC addressed to patients and healthcare professionals;
- Important advice on the medicine's packaging;
- The authorised pack size — the amount of medicine in a pack is chosen so to ensure that the medicine is used correctly;
- The medicine's legal status — the way a medicine is supplied to the patient (e.g. with or without prescription) can help to minimise its risks.

Together, these measures constitute *routine risk minimisation* measures.

In the case of Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets, these measures are supplemented with additional risk minimization measures mentioned under relevant important risks, below.

In addition to these measures, information about adverse reactions is collected continuously and regularly analysed so that immediate action can be taken as necessary. These measures constitute *routine pharmacovigilance activities*.

If important information that may affect the safe use of Apinovia is not yet available, it is listed under 'missing information' below.

II.A List of important risks and missing information

Important risks of Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets are risks that need special risk management activities to further investigate or minimise the risk, so that the medicinal product can be safely taken. Important risks can be regarded as identified or potential. Identified risks are concerns for which there is sufficient proof of a link with the use of Apinovia 2.5 mg and 5 mg film-coated tablets. Potential risks are concerns for which an association with the use of this medicine is possible based on available data, but this association has not been established yet and needs further evaluation. Missing information refers to information on the safety of the medicinal product that is currently missing and needs to be collected (e.g. on the long-term use of the medicine).
