

Part VI: Summary of the risk management plan for femiLoges® 4 mg magensaftresistente Tabletten (Extractum Rheum rhaponticum - ERr 731)

Summary of risk management plan for ERr 731

This is a summary of the risk management plan (RMP) for femiLoges. The RMP details important risks of femiLoges, how these risks can be minimised, and how more information will be obtained about femiLoges's risks and uncertainties (missing information).

femiLoges's summary of product characteristics (SmPC) and its package leaflet give essential information to healthcare professionals and patients on how femiLoges should be used.

Important new concerns or changes to the current ones will be included in updates of the RMP of femiLoges.

I. The medicine and what it is used for

femiLoges is authorised as:

- Herbal medicinal product for the relief of menopausal complaints in women, such as hot flushes.

It contains a standardized botanical extract of Siberian rhubarb *Rheum rhaponticum* L as the active substance and it is taken by mouth.

II. Risks associated with the medicine and activities to minimise or further characterise the risks

Important risks of femiLoges, together with measures to minimise such risks and the proposed studies for learning more about femiLoges's risks, are outlined below.

Measures to minimise the risks identified for medicinal products can be:

- Specific Information, such as warnings, precautions, and advice on correct use, in the package leaflet and SmPC addressed to patients and healthcare professionals;
- Important advice on the medicine's packaging;
- The authorised pack size — the amount of medicine in a pack is chosen so to ensure that the medicine is used correctly;
- The medicine's legal status — the way a medicine is supplied to the patient (e.g. with or without prescription) can help to minimise its risks.

Together, these measures constitute *routine risk minimisation* measures.

In addition to these measures, information about adverse events is collected continuously and regularly analysed so that immediate action can be taken as necessary. These measures constitute *routine pharmacovigilance activities*.

II.A List of important risks and missing information

Important risks of femiLoges are risks that need special risk management activities to further investigate or minimise the risk, so that the medicinal product can be safely taken. Important risks of femiLoges can be regarded as identified or potential. Identified risks are concerns for which there is sufficient proof of a link with the use of femiLoges. Potential risks are concerns for which an association with the use of this medicine is possible based on some preliminary data, but this association has not been fully proven and needs further evaluation. Missing information refers to information on the safety of the medicinal product that is currently missing and needs to be collected (e.g. on the long-term use of the medicine).
